For New York residents, 65 and over who do not meet the eligibility requirements in the table above, there are other ways to qualify for Medicaid. 1) Medically Needy Pathway – In a nutshell, one may still be eligible for Medicaid services even if they are over the income limit if they have high medical bills.

New York Health Access - Financial Eligibility

Updated September 18, 2020: Medicaid is the federal-and-state-funded health insurance program for low-income, needy Americans and their families. States jointly fund and run their programs, so Medicaid eligibility varies, depending on where you live. Medicaid eligibility requirements are broadly based on income, age, disability, pregnancy, household size and the applicant's household role.

In 2019, the income limit is set at \$2,313 per month and the asset limits at \$2,000 for an individual. MAGI Medicaid does not cover everything. Your Assets, MAGI, and Medicaid Eligibility

Medicaid eligibility for individuals 65 and older or who have blindness or a disability is generally determined using the income methodologies of the SSI program administered by the Social Security Administration (some states, known as 209(b) states, use certain more restrictive eligibility criteria

than SSI, but still largely apply SSI methodologies).

Sheltering excess income in a pooled-income trust is one of the most popular ways for someone above the income limit to qualify for Medicaid. NY State policy is that excess income placed in a pooled income trust (the name comes from the way the money is held by the trust, but each beneficiary has their own account) by a disabled individual be disregarded for Community Medicaid budgeting.

The New York State Medicaid program provides health care assistance to low income families, including minor children and pregnant women as well as elderly and disabled individuals. Although the federal government provides the funds and some basic requirements, most of the eligibility rules are set by the state of New York.

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
