The Sociolinguistic Variable “It begins with the simple act of noticing a variation – that there are two alternative ways of saying the same thing” [1] Labov’s quote here is pretty self-explanatory of what sociolinguistic variation is: it is simply different words, sounds and language people use to explain the same thing.

Sociolinguistic Variation Sociolinguistic variation takes into account the fact that the different linguistic variants may correlate with social factors including age, socioeconomic class, gender, ethnic background, region, and sexual orientation.
